School concept

- §1: Abolition of the **participation** (Medicine: Dr. rer. nat.)
 old: participation of a natural sciences degree-awarding institution in the evaluation process
 new: **guidelines and criteria** for awarding the doctoral degree as well as quality management in
 consultance with TUM Board of Management
 - → transitional period until enactment of criteria: **decision by Dean** in consultance with BoM

Faculty Graduate Center

Graduate Center of another Institution

Subsequent change of Graduate Center

Changing Graduate Centers

Doctoral candidates in the Faculty of Medicine may – instead of being member of the MGC – choose to become **member of another graduate center**, therefore both **consent** of faculty as well as graduate center are required. HELENA und IGSSE have been generally accepted by the Faculty of Medicine





- §3: Dr. med. (dent.)/Dr. med. sci.: successful completion of the medical/dental examination mandatory
- §5: "university degree" from foreign countries is no longer prerequisite
- §6: Termination of the supervisory relationship
 - by mutual agreement
 - by the doctoral candidate and
 - **new**: unilaterally by supervisor in exceptional cases, e.g. if there are valid academic reasons, or if the relationship and trust are broken, and after a negative feedback talk and a failed mediation process

Doctoral candidates will be removed from the **doctoral candidacy** list when they fail to conclude the **annual data confirmation in DocGS** for three years in a row, applicable 3 months after the last missing data confirmation and after a hearing period





§7: types of dissertation: monography, publication-based and meda dissertation

Appendix 6 [ad § 6 (9)]

Publication-based Dissertation

Publication-based dissertations will be accepted provided that the supervisor has given his/her written approval and the following requirements are met:

1. the dissertation must include an introductory and methodology section (20 pages); a discussion section across dissertation topics including a review of relevant literature;

2. the dissertation must include at least two first-author papers accepted for publication (full paper in an international, English language, peer-reviewed journal);

3. the candidate must be the first author of all publications included;

4. the dissertation must include a summary of each publication (one page), indicating the individual contributions of the candidate;

5. inclusion of selected original papers requires a separate letter of approval from each publisher. All other publications must be listed with a full publication citation for each. In the set of copies for the members of the examining committee all original papers must be included separately.

Written scientific document

Another medium, in particular a permanentely documented creative performance such as an audio- or video file

→ Faculty passes regulations regarding publication-based and media dissertations (in progress).

Temporary solution for publication-based dissertations: Appendix 6 PromO 2014 as guideline





Excursus: qualification program (TUM GS Statutory Regulations §16)

- Qualification Program: Discussion of scientific findings/research project in the international scientific community
 - → Discussion in the international scientific community requires the **acceptance** of publications or international conference papers that are subject to peer review
- → MGC Statutory Regulations will be adopted with differentiation between the doctoral programs





- §8: no certificate of good conduct, digital submission possible
- §9: **oral examinations should** happen within **6 months** (prompt preparation of expert opinions)
- §10: Examination Committee
 - **TUM JF** are authorized to conduct examinations for candidates supervised by them (= work in their research group)
 - Degree-awarding institution may can also be represented by a professor appointed jointly with another degreeawarding institution of TUM or a non-university research institution
 - if a supervisor authorized to conduct examinations at the start of the dissertation project leaves before the examination committee is appointed, this supervisor may continue to serve as supervisor and thesis examiner for a period of three years from the time of his*her leave

 Deviating internal regulation Faculty of Medicine: 1 year*
 - first supervisor should be appointed as first examiner (no longer automatically)
 - two external examiners possible, if the examination committee consists of three persons





- §11/17: Grading of the dissertation
 - Passed, differentiated in
 - Magna cum laude (Particularly commendable scientific achievement, assessment of both the dissertation work and the oral examination with at least magna cum laude by all examiners)
 - > Summa cum laude (outstanding scientific achievement in international comparison, assessment of both the dissertation work and the oral examination with summa cum laude by all examiners)
 - Not passed

Note: On the doctoral certificate there will only be shown "magna cum laude" or "summa cum laude", "passed" will not be shown.






- §14/15: oral examination
 - invitation for oral examination possible via **announcement on homepage, in the intranet or via e-mail** (additional members and members of public)
 - oral examination can be conducted either in **German or English** (decision of examination board)
 - permission for members of the public to attend the oral examination (decision of examination board)
 - virtual examinations are possible (decision of examination board)





• §21: Publication – **no paper copies** needed for university library







• §29: Final provisions

- Application for registration on the doctoral candidacy list after October 1st, 2021 → new version of the Doctoral Regulation applies without limitation
- Application for registration on the doctoral candidacy list before September 30th, 2021 → new version of the Doctoral Regulation applies with the following limitations:
 - § 6 change of Graduate Center / removal from the doctoral candidacy list
 - § 7 publication-based dissertation
 - § 8 feedback talk (already mandatory in Faculty of Medicine)
 - § 11(2) / §15(3) / §16(1) / §17(2) grading of dissertation / oral examination / grading of certificate





Old regulations

Advantages

- discussion in the international scientific
 community = <u>submitted</u> contribution
- requirements for publication-based dissertation have been set

Disadvantages

- no "magna cum laude" possible
- no choice/change of Graduate Center

New regulations

Advantages

- choice/change of Graduate Center
- "magna cum laude" possible

Disadvantages

- discussion in the international scientific
 community = <u>accepted</u> contribution
- requirements for publication-based dissertation not final
- removal from candidacy list upon fail of annual data confirmation


Not relevant

- possibly media dissertation (old and new regulations)
- electronic submission (old and new regulations)
- Feedback Talk already mandatory in MGC regulations

Please note:

- In case of a publication-based dissertation: Contact your degree-awarding institution concerning specific requirements for publication-based dissertations.
- The documentation of the feedback meeting is now part of the mandatory qualification elements. The meeting is based on a lecture open to members of the university or a written interim report.
- The **discussion in the international scientific community** now requires **acceptance** (not only submission) of publications/conference contributions in a peer-reviewed process. The Graduate Centers may have further requirements.
- → Please note that after a change of regulations the Graduate Centers will have to check the mandatory qualification elements in DocGS again. Some steps in your process tree will thus have to be reset. If you had one already, you will also have to fill out the submission form again. Please schedule accordingly.
